

**BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2017
7:00 P.M.**

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Abatta called the meeting of September 11, 2017 to order at the Robinson Township Municipal Complex, 1000 Church Hill Road, Robinson Township, PA 15205 at 7:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL: Mancini-Present, Barefoot-Absent, Kisow-Absent, Shiwarski-Absent, Abatta- Present. Also in attendance were Township Manager Silka, Assistant Manager Susko, Solicitor Sam Delfonso Township Engineer Mike Meyer, and Township Secretary Kristen Police for the purpose of taking minutes.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY: JOE MARTELLI

Joe Martelli: Good evening, my name is Joe Martelli. I am here this evening for to share some information on the Malitia memorial that we will having on November 11th. This is the first time that a local government will be paying tribute to the Militia soldiers of their township, and it will also be the first time that they will receive a proclamation and citations and medals as well. So, the Militia has pretty much been ignored through history so we will be setting a standard for other communities as well.

Chairman Abatta: Well anything we can do to support the Veterans and the ladies and men that gave the ultimate sacrifice for our country and you can understand that Robinson Township is behind it 100% .So thank you and we are looking forward to it.

MUNICIPAL COMPLEX UPDATE: DESIGN TEAM

Genna: Good evening, I am Genna Drusack with Weber Murphy Fox also here with Hays Design Group. Andrew Capanara and Tim Brady to give an update on the new Municipal Building for Robinson Township. An update from our previous presentation last month. We have revised and continued to work through the floor plans we have met with all of the departments involved with this facility. We vetted their spaces and we feel confident that they have significant input in their say and they are reflective in the plans that we show tonight we worked on the exterior elevations as well so we have continued to work through plan elevation and the overall design and we are wrapping up or what we refer to as design development we are wrapping that up this week with a design development set to give to the Township construction manager for an estimate to be reviewed next month. These are our current designs, this is a three dimensional image looking at a brick masonry building with some stone work, and again housing the

administrative offices, the police department and the library of Robinson Township. Any questions?

Chairman Abatta: We don't have any questions here from the Board. We are all familiar with and have been working together as a team and a unit and we appreciate your concern and we have been working with Mr. Fullen who basically represents us so I think you have answered most of our questions whenever we met and discussed some things here but I am sure at some point in time there will be questions along the line so I hope we can reserve you making this presentation, maybe to do it again at some other meeting at some point. The public may have some questions once it gets out there and they realize that we are moving along.

Genna: We anticipate being here monthly however you foresee us meeting. At the October 2nd meeting we plan to be here.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

The Engineer's Report is attached.

Mr. Meyer: A couple of Commissioners actions that are requested tonight. #16 on your agenda is the Marks Landing Bond we are recommending that the Township reduce the current bond amount of \$371,465.060 to a new bond remaining amount to \$232,200.00 Item #17 on your agenda is the Ridge at Robinson we are recommending that the Township release the current bond \$196,645.68. All of their punch list items have been completed as well as their as built. The Clever Park Pool we are requesting that the Township make payment in the amount of \$56,914.35 to the contractor Shiloh Industrial Contractors, 2% retainage is being held upon completion of the punch list and I will also say that work is continuing on it, they were pouring the walls and I am not sure that got done today or if it's going to be some time later this week. That's the walls for the new zero depth entry pool so it is going along schedule.

Chairman Abatta: I have been down there every day Mike for the most part and Shiloh is doing a great job and from my engineering eyes they have the baby pool formed out and they have all the baluster stone formed around it and I guess they are ready to pour .

Mr. Meyer: I know that it is sometime this week I wasn't sure if it was today.

Chairman Abatta: They are making great progress as far as I am concerned.

Mr. Meyer: Arbor Trail Phase II, this is a question that has come up before the developer has requested, it is item #23 on your agenda to allow for the paving of base beyond the October 1st deadline you have a deadline in your Ordinance that says October 1st , I do know that Penn Dot it's not based off of a date but more on temperature requirements so what I would recommend is that you approve this action contingent upon the items listed in our letter which is basically

conformance with Penn Dot standards. Item #21 is the Zivic Plan Lot align adjustment that had been recommended by the Planning Commission and item #20 is Arbor Trail Phase I parcel 8 the Planning Commission had also recommend approval of that subdivision and that is item #20. Going down I'll hit some of the highlights of the Municipal Building. We are still meeting with the Township and various officials to secure the sight. The MS4 – we have completed everything, we have not received any of the comments for the pollution reduction plan and the permit is required to be completed by September 16th. Item D, the Saldo Revisions a subdivision a land development Ordinance, we have been tasked to come up with a list, I met with Mr. Urbano and Mr. Silka couple months ago to look at some of the items that are in our Saldo such as that October 1st deadline which we talked about earlier which needs to be revised and brought up to current standards. We have completed the draft of that so we will be meeting with Mr. Urbano and Mr. Silka to go over it and based off of that we will have some changes to the sub divisional land development ordinance which are much needed, it hasn't been done- Rick- for seventeen years, I think this is something that is well- it is the same wavers that you guys are approving every month it seems. The other big thing is we really came up with a new check list for all of the plans that come in, so that we know what has to be submitted and everything else, we really revised that.

Road Program 2017- we are corresponding with the contractors to finalize some minor punch list items that have to be done as well as a resident's complaint. The drainage investigations that I talked about at the last meeting- Conley Drive that plan is complete Mr. Silka and I are meeting with Public Works sometime either next week to go over the plan. The response that we have is a letter to 594 McMichael we prepared a report the details the reason that this new building which is the Cable Property if you've seen it right as we come out here. It's not adversely affecting the property at 594 McMichael as they claim, they are claiming that it's making the wetlands encroach upon their building, we disagree and we said why we had disagreed with that.

The other ones are being worked on Elliot Drive and Coketown Road.

DEVELOPMENTAL INSPECTIONS

Arbor Trail Phase I and Phase II – They have been talking about that they have a lot of different trees that are out there however when their plans were approved they had listed a lot of different trees that had been done. The developer is coming back with looking at a payment in lieu of putting some of these trees in. Mr. Urbano and I have met with him they are going to come back with a letter to the Board, that'll be on the next agenda. Lastly, the other ones going on there really isn't anything important on them but the last one Stafford Park, the sidewalks have been poured and right now we are waiting for the final bond reduction, bond release request from the developer. So, I think everything has been done at Stafford.

Chairman Abatta: I saw at Stafford that they poured the sidewalks and then they took them out the next couple days later. Did it get rained on, or were they not to code? They are back in now, it seems like they're complete.

Mr. Meyer: I am not sure of that. I'll talk with my inspector about that.

Mr. Urbano: There was an error in construction. They poured stone without moving the grass. They had to redo them.

Mr. Meyer: I know they were supposed to contact us before they had poured them, I know that they contacted us when they set the forms but they were supposed to call us before.

POLICE REPORT

Chief Vietmeier submitted a copy of the August Police Report which is attached to the minutes.

Chairman Abatta: Chief is not here this evening. Mr. Silka will you please enlighten us?

Mr. Silka: Yes, Mr. Chairman, on behalf of the Chief who couldn't be here.

For August 2017 there were 661 complaints, that brings the year to date complaints to 5,393. There were 130 traffic citations issued, 13 non traffic citations, 81 alarms, 47 adult criminal arrests, 4 juvenile arrests and 39 accidents investigated. During the month of September, the police department put 25,325 miles on the cars.

Chairman Abatta: We have a copy of everything that you eluded to Jeff and with some other information.

ADMINISTRATION UPDATE

Mr. Silka: I have a few things. and I am also going to incorporate if it's ok with the chairman, the public works report into the administrative update.

We have our Act 172 Ordinance public hearing is scheduled for 6:30 October 2nd and just to refresh- Act 172 is the real estate and earned income tax, tax relief incentive for active volunteer fireman and auxiliary persons who live in Robinson Township. The public hearing is a requirement of the Act and had to be published 30 days prior we did publish it 30 days prior so we are on track for that. The public hearing and the potential adoption of the hearing at the October 2nd meeting.

We are well into the 2018 budget cycle. We are starting the internal work of programming the department budgets to put together the draft budget to be able

to be presented to the Township Commissioners at the November meeting so the staff is working on that then we will schedule our budget hearings, budget adoptions in November and December.

A couple of agenda items on #30 is a four post lift for the public works garage that is our lift that we are able to lift our large trucks on. It had deteriorated it was

not available in any state bid or Costar so we did do a public bid on it and Mohawks Lift was the low and actual only bidder, the only one that actually called when we were looking to get some quotes for \$79,707.48. I did meet with the mechanic and the public works foreman and we are in concurrence that they did meet all of our requirements so I am going to recommend that the Board does approve that lift purchase and that is budgeted in the 2017 budget.

There are two Resolutions 26 and 27 which are our annual state pension aid resolutions that is basically business as usual. There is nothing new on there. The public works pension is a private pension with their union and the police pension is the one where we do have a contribution annually too but our police pension is still performing about market so we are relatively happy with the relatively low pension contribution considering some people are in the seven figures we are still under \$500,000 for pension relief so we are pretty good.

The pool update as Mr. Meyer had alluded to, the pool is doing great. I will be doing another live update for the pool tomorrow on the Facebook page; I get a lot of good feedback from those little videos. We are still working for Memorial Day 2018 to have the ribbon cutting and I am gonna say the mass jump in.

Dr. Mancini: Your Facebook posts are awesome. They are AWESOME!

Mr. Silka: We do have a very good No.29 a motion for Kristen Police, our Township Secretary who tomorrow completes her one year probationary period and is the administrative recommendation that the Board do grant her full employee status and allow her to become a full time member of the Township family we will call it.

Chairman Abatta: One year already Ms. Police? You still around with us?

Mrs. Police: Absolutely.

Chairman Abatta: Congratulations! One year gone by already. That's insane.

Mr. Silka: I have a few public works updates. One is the Clever Park parking island restoration is an ongoing project, we hope to have that done before the snow flies this year and then we will probably do some final landscaping next year.

For engineering, the Falck Road gate is ordered and we are waiting for the gate to come in. It was ordered right after it was approved, I believe at the August meeting. It hasn't come in yet as soon as that comes in we will get that in as well

as the Falck Road turnaround. we did finalize the easement with the property owners so will be moving and redoing the turnaround for Falck Road that coincides with the gate.

Conley Drive and Coketown Road- we are meeting with Mr. Meyer as he alluded to and we will be doing the engineering projects. Coketown Road will be done late fall after the leaves and the vegetation die off so we do have access to the stream without having to machete our way through.

We have completed Woodland Drive pipe project and the October fall leaf pick up; our fall leaf pick up will start the last week of October. As that gets closer we will run our schedules on Facebook and on the website. So everyone knows when we will be doing it.

I do want to do a personal shout out to Bill Bianco- who did take over as our interim Public Works foreman in Mr. Volpe's absence as he has resigned. And the Autumn Fest this year our public works went above and beyond what was asked of them especially when we had a little problem with our electric in the middle of the festival- most people probably didn't even realize that- but they did get on that and it was a very good effort from our public works department. It is a lot of overtime and a lot of work. We do have a small department but everybody did pitch in so I do want to shout out and praise them in public for that. Mr. Chairman, that is what I have today.

FINANCE REPORT

Mr. Kezmarsky submitted a copy of the August Finance report which is attached.

Mr. Silka: Just real quick- our finances are tracking in the positive. Our earned income tax and local service tax is tracking within the budget probably they will both exceed their line in the end. Our real estate tax has exceeded its budgeted expectation over by over \$100, 00.00 this year as we have some new properties coming on full taxation now. Our interim tax we budgeted \$5,000 that has been an area that we have been fluctuating but we brought in \$28,000 to date that is due to the work of our delinquent tax collector and getting properties on the books. Real estate transfer tax we budgeted \$325,000 we are now at \$332,000 so we are starting to see properties move in the Township again. Our general fund balance is healthy at over \$3,000,000.00 and there's really nothing in the budget this month that would see great anomalies.

SUSTAINABILITY REPORT

Ms. Susko: Good evening, just a couple quick updates on our grants today. Nothing really major just the Duquesne street light grant that we mentioned last month, we are still waiting to hear back on that we applied for some street light replacement upgrades on Glass Road haven't heard a yes or no either way I'll definitely pass that along. The recycling performance grant now that is the state

level grant we put the county level recycling report in earlier in the spring and that kind of preps us for putting in the state grant which is where we get all the money per ton for what's recycled by the residents are also, I think some of the leaf collection at least in the county total so that's kind of that vegetation waste I think that's what they call it. That's due in the beginning of October, we are in the process of compiling that now we pretty much have all of the information we just need to get it submitted and that'll be done in the next couple of weeks and hopefully we will hear back soon what our grant is this year. It is looking like just comparing the totals of tonnage from last year to this year to this year we probably will be getting a larger grant but you never know until the check is in your bank account.

The Banner Community designations- that's one of the main things that we have been working on this calendar year we only have a couple of more boxes to check off before we can apply for ALOM Allegheny League of Municipalities Banner Community for 2018 so the last two things are the fall conference coming up at the end of September for ALOM. Mr. Silka is planning on attending that and that satisfies our conference requirement section and the last thing is sort of this community engagement piece so we have the newsletter and we have fulfilled that and one of the other ways that we have chosen to check that box is by working with the high school to do some sort of class room activity or maybe a career day or whatever makes sense as the opportunity arise so this is something that I talked to the school about in the spring but it just didn't fit into the curriculum that they had at that time. They kind of deal with local government earlier in the fall so I did speak to some of the teachers right back when the last school year was ending and discussed maybe the civic study class if there is some opportunity for me to come and explain how local government works so I'll be at the ribbon cutting ceremony this weekend at the high school so I'll definitely restart the conversation make sure that we get this done within this calendar year and that's really the last thing that we have to check off for that then we submit the application and ideally we get designated as a banner community so that'll be nice to see that because we have been working hard on that all year from all the different parts of government so that's really exciting coming up.

The last thing that I have on my report today is the National Green Infrastructure certification class. This is something that is promoted by the different water authorities associations and water conservation agencies across the state – it's sort of a new certification, not too many people have it yet but it is focused on storm water management different types of sustainable or green infrastructure the construction techniques that sort of go along with that so I am attending that its every Tuesday and Thursday for the next several weeks through about halfway in October and I'll have a certification exam. Thought I was done with grad school but not quite. It is very familiar but it's a really good class I have been to one so far and tomorrow will be the second session and I can already tell we are going to be learning a lot of useful things so this also helps to contribute to our MS4 program requirements for staff education so I am kind of the guinea pig for this one. That's all I have for tonight, do you have any questions?

Dr. Mancini: Jeff, I don't know if you can answer this but I get stuff for the storm water management all the time and there is a storm water bus tour and it says on here that it is part of that green infrastructure.

Mr. Silka: We are not going because Millvale is set up a little bit different as its set up as a Borough it has a lot more city like features that so that type of infrastructure doesn't lend well to township development.

Dr. Mancini: I just wanted to know because I don't know if you get those emails, but I get them.

Mr. Silka: Yes, we get them and there are some that we go to there are some that really don't apply to us we are more geared into contractors and developers.

Ms. Susko: And with seminars like that you have to pick and choose, our issues are just a little bit different, we have to deal with stream run off more so than – we have a lot of cars coming down Main Street or something like that so that's probably what that bus tour.

Dr. Mancini: Just because you mentioned it and it says exactly that in the email.

Ms. Susko: Any other questions?

BUILDING INSPECTOR/ZONING OFFICER REPORT

Mr. Urbano submitted a copy of the August Building Inspector/Zoning Officer Report which is attached.
