

**BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING
MONDAY, DECEMBER 4, 2017
7:00 P.M.**

CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Abatta called the meeting of December 4, 2017 to order at the Robinson Township Municipal Complex, 1000 Church Hill Road, Robinson Township, PA 15205 at 7:00 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL: Mancini-Present, Barefoot-Present, Kisow-Present, Shiwarski-Present, Abatta- Present. Also in attendance were, Township Manager Piccolino, Assistant Manager Susko, Solicitor Jack Cambest, Township Engineer Mike Meyer, Chief Vietmeier, Planning Director Rick Urbano, Finance Officer Jerry Kezmarsky and Township Secretary Kristen Police for the purpose of taking minutes.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

The Engineer's Report is attached.

Commissioners Action Requested

I apologize that should be Silver Summit, not Arbor Trail. I am so used to doing Arbor Trail once a month so I just wrote that in.

Silver Summit- We are recommending that the Township reduce the current bond of \$1.5 million to a new bond remaining amount of \$381,799.00 and that is item #15 on your consent agenda.

Clever Park Pool- The first is recommending the approval of change order#2 in the amount of \$27,704.00 this increase is due to the reconstruction of some light pool footings and the replacement of the electrical service. The footings when we went to go look at them they were not in the best shape as well as not as deep as we needed them so we had to replace them since we are replacing them we said we might as well just move them to a better location we tried to keep them but it didn't work out. The electrical- where they thought some of the electrical services were coming from and everything else were not where they ended up being so they basically that had to be revised. There is also a deduct in there on this change order for some of the grounding, instead we used some of the rebar that was in the concrete decking so that was a deduct on that so that's our total.

Chairman Abatta: Mike, are they are going to change the lighting in and out of itself, like from incandescent to a newer type form?

Mr. Meyer: Yes, LED's

Chairman Abatta: So that is included there?

Mr. Meyer: That wasn't included there but that's just the light pole that is being moved, yeah. We are putting in new light fixtures as well, that was always going to be done.

Chairman Abatta: Like the ones that burn less energy is that what you're saying?

Mr. Meyer: Yes, and within inside the building as well.

The next item is the and it's on your added agenda, and that's the invoice for the contractor. The contractor as I was saying earlier does everything on schedule, his invoicing leaves a little bit to be desired. So unfortunately, we just received this on Thursday night that's why it is on the added agenda as opposed to the regular agenda. But since they are staying on schedule I do want to make sure we got this in on time for payment.

Robinson Square- Planning Commission has recommended approval of this site plan contingent upon developer's agreement and the response the engineers comments.

Parkside- This is something that is a little bit different. The developer has requested that we act as the applicant for a pipe that is going into an inlet on Penn Dot, apparently that is the new thing that Penn Dot is requiring that the Township's act as the agent even though its being done by somebody else. So, this a Resolution that has to be passed. It is standard language for them. And this is something that we talked about with Mr. Silka previously and again I think it is something that we had approved it so it should be passed.

CAPITOL PROJECTS

Clever Park Pool- It is remaining ahead of schedule.

Municipal Building- We started on design and development plans these will be completed by mid -February completion of DD's will allow us to submit permits to DEP.

MS4- Are completed.

Saldo Revisions- We will probably set up a meeting with the new administrator and by the way nice to see ya at the new one. So, once we have that we will have a meeting with Mr. Urbano as well.

2017 Road Program- I really want to set a date- that if this is not done because it's the end of 2017 if its not done I think we should have Public Works go out and do the work and bill against the contractor and I am looking at the data as of December 15th and I am going to send a letter out to them tomorrow basically

saying if it's not done by December 15th we will have the Public Works department do it and we will take the remainder out of your retainage.

Mr. Shiwarski: What is the scope of work?

Mr. Meyer: The scope of work is basically to fix a driveway, probably looking at a cost of about \$3 to \$4,000.

Mr. Shiwarski: One particular resident?

Mr. Meyer: yes, one resident left. Also, there is something about a person who had a bumper that they claim that was not done and I have asked for information that I can make a judgement or I can go back to you and make a judgement on whether or not this was done because I have not received that. We will have the person's bumper fixed and we will take it out of the contract as well.

Chairman Abatta: There is enough money to cover both of those issues?

Mr. Meyer: Yes about \$9,000.

Various investigations- all of these are ongoing.

DEVELOPMENTAL INSPECTIONS

The only one that really anything is new on is Pleasant View. I am putting together with Mr. Urbano's help and it didn't make it on to the agenda because we were still working on it as of Friday but I am putting it on with Mr. Urbano's help getting a list of the certificate of occupancies so we can formulate a letter out to the developer stating that a traffic light has to go in once that happens then we will have a certain period of time in order to get started on that.

Mr. Barefoot: Mike, if he doesn't do it in a timely fashion we still have money held that we would have that done.

Mr. Meyer: There is a bond in place and at that point I would turn it over to the solicitor.

Mr. Barefoot: Ok, because that was a question from a couple of the residents.

Mr. Meyer: Yes, that is why we have bonds and we go through all of the bond reductions and everything throughout.

DEVELOPMENTAL REVIEWS

Robinson Square as I mentioned are items 13 and 14 on your agenda and that is my report. Any questions?

Chairman Abatta: Any questions for Mr. Meyer?

Mr. Barefoot: I do. The Windgate Drive Mike is that- will that be dedicated to us? Is it up to speed to be dedicated to us. That was a question.

Mr. Meyer: My impression to us and it has been a while that I have looked into this and there has been all kinds of different issues going back and forth with it. And my best answer is I am not sure because of the way it was written and everything how it was done there was a lot of issues when they went to do it a lot of the work was done without inspection this was even prior to us coming on board so it was 10-12 years ago. So, I am not sure how that is going to work out and I know that there are different kind of agreements that are kind of contradictory in themselves. Mr. Urbano, do you want to add anything to that.

Mr. Urbano: Mr. Barefoot would you like me to answer that?

Mr. Barefoot: Yeah that question was posed to me from some of the residents down there at Pleasantview.

Mr. Urbano: I received a letter also from Mr. Chen's attorney to have the Township take dedication of it. Originally, in the findings of facts and conclusions of law that we have in place from back in 1999 when Mr. Mazzati started phase II of the condominiums it states in there that the road will not be offered for dedication or accepted for dedication by the Township until all eight phases are complete. And basically, at one time the road- and I don't think it has been put the finish surface on it we have that road bonded so I can tell you that there is a provision where if the Board of Commissioners want to take dedication of that road and close out the project then he can offer for dedication but until he does that the finding of fact of conclusion of law say that as long as there is going to be development going to be done there the other six phases.

Mr. Barefoot: There is no time period on that development Rick? I mean, is it ten years, five years.

Mr. Urbano: There is no time limit on it. The only thing is that it has been started the NPC says if a development is started that within five years it can go on as long as the developer meets the standards.

Mr. Barefoot: So, who maintains the roads at this point, would the Association down there maintain that?

Mr. Urbano: They are responsible and from what my understanding is that Mr. Chen turned that road over to the Association so it's their responsibility to maintain and keep it up to a usable standard.

Mr. Barefoot: So, our position isn't until the entire project is completed right now.

Mr. Urbano: Or shut down or finished.

Mr. Barefoot: Or shut down or finished, we will not take dedication to that road.

Mr. Urbano: Without saying we won't. That's the answer- we would have to have Mike go out there and inspect it and make sure it meets all the Township standards then there is a possibility that we could want to take dedication if he is shutting the project down and no more development then we could take dedication and put it on our rules.

Chairman Abatta: There are standards that have to be absolved.

Mr. Mancini: Rick, you said though that the Association is responsible for the road, right?

Mr. Urbano: Yes

Mr. Mancini: So that top coat that has to go on there who pays for that?

Mr. Urbano: Well basically we have bond money for that also.

Mr. Mancini: So, if the developer says I won't do it, we have bond money for that?

Mr. Urbano: I sat down with Jack and Mike when Mr. Chen got the property we went item for item through that development agreement and Jack did a super job. We maintained everything in there, we kept the bonds at the exact amount to that they had to be from the start of the project and its all covered. The only person that's going to lose, if he doesn't do what he is supposed to do, is him before we have the right to know bond.

Mr. Barefoot: Ok Rick, thank you.

Chairman Abatta: Mike, I am going to pass something down to you, I want you to approve this amount in the item number 21. So, just see if this item amount is correct and pass it back to me. Any more questions gentlemen?

POLICE REPORT

Chief Vietmeier submitted a copy of the November Report, which is attached to the minutes.

Good evening everyone. For the month of November. The police department answered 619 complaints for a year to date of 7385 there were 154 traffic citations issued, 12 non- traffic citations issued, 59 alarms, 29 adult criminal arrests, 4 juvenile arrests, 43 accidents for a year to date total of 408 and there were almost 21,000 miles put on the police units. That is my report, any questions?

Mr. Barefoot: Yes, I have a lot of questions, I don't know why. Sunday work down there, I know your officers at Pleasantview. There was some Sunday work going

on down there and they have stopped it the trucks just to make you aware I don't know we can have people ride down there on Sunday to make sure they don't do it again. It seems though that Mr. Chen is just wanting to work on Sundays and that was a question that was opposed to me and I know your officers have followed through on this so... we appreciate that. I just wanted to address it because that was addressed to me from a couple of the residents down there.

Chief Vietmeier: Ok, I'll have them check again this next Sunday here.

Mr. Barefoot: Ok, thank you sir.

Mr. Kisow: The boat from under the bridge is gone.

ADMINISTRATION UPDATE

Chairman Abatta: Administration update. Mr. Piccolino, this is our first meeting that Mr. Piccolino is enlightening us, he is our new Township manager. He comes very well recommended from some other districts that he has worked for and I am sure Frank is going to be an asset to our Township so Frank, welcome to the real world in Robinson here and time for the administrative update.

Mr. Piccolino: Thank you Mr. Chairman, I will keep my report short and sweet I just want to personally thank you for hiring me and the confidence in the next Township manager. I am very excited to be here, it's only been six days but the staff has treated me very well which most of the them are here. I just look forward to keep working. I attended the light up here on Friday, the family and I and we felt really welcome and met a lot of good people and once again I can't thank you enough and I look forward too many more.

SUSTAINABILITY REPORT

Ms. Susko: Alright, real short and sweet tonight. There is not too much green going on when everything is going to be covered in snow. Hopefully soon we can stop the leaf pick up. The only thing that I have got on the report is leaf removal – we did extend that through this week We have had unseasonably warm weather I think it was almost sixty this week so we extended by about a month this year, probably next year we will take a look and see if there is anything we can do scheduling wise to not have to keep extending it to just to prepare for what may be a longer leaf season. That's everything that I have for this month, but if you have any questions I'd be happy to answer them.

Chairman Abatta: I think we have covered some before in Executive session R.J.

FINANCE REPORT

Mr. Shiwarski: Jerry do you have anything for us today? We had our annual budget ahead of this meeting, the budget is – Frank – passed and will be

available online for viewing? So again, thanks to all the department heads again even though its passed the last month of the year it's an ongoing process and it takes effort from all the department Township employees who give their feedback to the department heads who then talk to administration and then combine through historical we come up with a budget that enables us to continue to be a first- class township as far as the service and safety that is provided. So, thanks everyone for your involvement in the process.

Mr. Piccolino: Correct.

Mr. Kezmarsky: Well we are in the home stretch, we are in December now. EIT collections for the year for the month of November \$5,705 for a total collection of \$2,972,000 very close to the budget amount. LST taxes \$236,000 collected for the month of November. \$774,000 collected for a year to date.

Mr. Shiwarski: I see that my concern was a little premature we got very close to within \$26,000 of our budget right and with one month to go.

Mr. Kezmarsky: That is correct, very close, very close. Real estate property taxes \$20,000 again in the home stretch here. Total for the year \$4,682,000 a little over budget but we tend to budget very conservatively on property taxes not knowing how well collections will go from year to year. So that's actually a pretty good sign there. Taxes \$65,000 collected for the year. Real estate delinquent \$96,000 collected for the year. Real estate transfer taxes \$454,000 well and above the conservative budget amount. Cash on hand \$1,726,000. We have two more payrolls for the month of December and depending on whatever invoices come through they average around \$400 to \$500,000 a month, we should be in a pretty good cash position going into the end of the year and going into the 2018 so that's my report. Any questions?

BUILDING INSPECTOR/ZONING OFFICER REPORT

Mr. Urbano submitted a copy of the November Building Inspector/Zoning Officer Report which is attached.

Mr. Urbano: Thank you Mr. Chairman. The fees collected for the month of November \$25,720 total collected for the year \$286,849. Building and or new construction for the month of November \$3,862,569 total for the year \$57,869,799. And you see the new construction is over from last year already without December and so it looks like we will surpass the building permit fees last year also because we are only \$5,000 short and we probably already have that on the books for the start of this month, so I think we are going to have another good year. Any questions?

Mr. Barefoot: Just one Rick. This is concerning Pleasantview again, the pool that is in there, there is a pool, who can use that? Or do we have to go back in the agreement and look?

Mr. Urbano: Well I can tell you what the agreement said, the agreement said that the clubhouse that was to be built in phase II which it is being built in phase II and the swimming pool are to be used by all the residents of Pleasantview.

Mr. Barefoot: Ok, that answers the question. I appreciate it.

Mr. Urbano: Anything else?

COMMISSIONERS COMMENTS

Dr. Mancini: I just have a quick comment for the Library folks. This Wednesday December 6th the library is holding two events. The second on the same day, they are having a holiday edition of songs for the Young Whippersnappers and I understand Commissioner Kisow is going to lead a rendition of O' Tanenbaum. So please come and see that. That's all I have.

Mr. Kisow: I want to wish everybody Happy Holidays and Merry Christmas and welcome Frank here, get used to it.

Mr. Shiwarski: First I would like to welcome Frank, looking forward to you to enlighten us all here and help us in 2018 and beyond Frank. This year's budget, real estate millage, earlier today we voted it's at 3.20 millage this is an increase of 6/10's of a mill compared to 2017 but Robinson Township's millage is still lower than 101 out of the 131 communities in Allegheny County. The median residence in the Township and this is based on the numbers from last year was \$139,000 this 6/10's of an increase will mean an \$83.40 increase per property residents. That comes to less than \$7 a month that will be used as the Township as it grows to ensure our First- Class public safety services that pave and plow the roads. Our three beautiful parks with the athletic fields, a fully renovated community pool that will be ready this spring and many other amenities so some of the high lights of the budget is 44% of the expenditures will go into providing public safety to it's residents, 32% of the expenditures will be used to improve and maintain the park facilities including plowing and salt materials for their winter seasons. This budget process that we have an I eluded to a little bit when Jerry gave his financial report earlier is not something that is taken lightly by the Board, by the administration or by the departments heads, its an ongoing process starting in January where we accumulate our historical data compare it to the flow of our expenditures and revenues and make a concerted attempt to get the most bang for your dollar to provide the best place to live, shop and worship for our residents. So, I just want to conclude with a thank you to our entire staff who contributes to the budget process and helps us put this together every year. Lastly, I want to wish everybody a Merry Christmas, Happy Holiday, safe and happy one, enjoy it in your own way. Hope to see everybody again in January and just a personal note, up on the Board here we are having a battle here with grandkids so I am up to four. I got a daughter now ok a granddaughter now. I don't know if they will be around to be able to vote for us but again I welcome my granddaughter Emily to the world.

Mr. Barefoot: Keep going, I got eight.

Chairman Abatta: Congratulations, well said on the budget and everything.

Mr. Barefoot: Sam, can I add one thing while we are on finance? I think a lot of things when we considered, you have to consider pools, expenses, what your putting back into them and it was just time to do the pool so the expenses for the pool should reduce. So hopefully that's one of the considerations we took into when we put the .6 in and its just improvements that we have to make. I mean the pool was leaking, there was a lot of things wrong with it. We were putting a lot maintenance into it. So, those are things that we are looking to save on to as we go forward. That's it.

Chairman Abatta: Like I always say we are not a farming community anymore. We are moving on into the 21st century here so we have to maintain our standards to do what we have to do here. With that said, Frank, again I would like to welcome you to Robinson Township. I hope your tenure here is long and

joyful. We appreciate you coming to work everyday and doing what you have to do. And as I say – welcome.


